About us

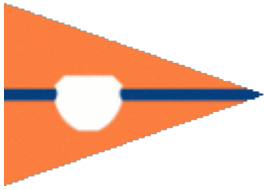
LBSC has been plying the waters of the Llyn Brenig reservoir since 1977, and is a small and friendly club that benefits - with its location and altitude of 1,200 feet above sea level - from

- No tides or currents
- No need to wash the salt off after every sail
- More reliable winds
- Less crowded water than most other inland locations
- Excellent boat storage facilities, and
- The beautiful surroundings (and attractions) of Welsh Water's Llyn Brenig Estate



LBSC's ambition is to make it easier for those interested in sailing to access facilities that enable them to 'give it a go' without having to commit to the expense of a boat, equipment and membership fees up front.

We hold various activities through the year to provide such opportunities, including our Try Sailing Days, Royal Yachting Association (RYA)-accredited Sailing Training Days (such as those featured in this Sheet), a Saturday Club for juniors and an 'open door' policy for enquirers to request a visit to the site to get to know us and - if desired - take their first steps toward participation in this exhilarating sport.

The Courses

The Courses will last 2 days (approx. 16 hours in total) and are taught by RYA-accredited Dinghy Instructors under the supervision of a Senior Instructor.

Trainees will be taught in small, flexible groups to ensure that each receives the tuition and support that they need. Each trainee be trained and assessed against the RYA Level 1 syllabus, which includes rigging, wind awareness, ropework, sailing techniques & manoeuvres, launching and recovery, some sailing theory and background, clothing and equipment, meteorology and capsized recovery - with the aim of each qualifying for the RYA's Level 1 Dinghy Sailing Certificate.

Trainees whose aptitude and ability show sufficient progress will be taken straight on into the RYA Level 2 syllabus, which includes more advanced levels of rigging for weather conditions, ropework, sailing techniques and manoeuvres, close-quarter handling, launching and recovery, capsized recovery, introductory racing, meteorology, anchoring and safety equipment, with the aim of qualifying for the RYA's Level 2 Dinghy Sailing Certificate. Youngsters will receive the equivalent RYA Stage 1 and/or Stage 2 Certificates, according to their progress.

Personal Equipment

Specialised equipment (wet suits, flotation jackets, helmets) will be available for loan at no cost - although trainees who have their own items of personal kit are welcome to use those, if they are deemed adequate by the Instructor.

Otherwise, warm, quick-drying, layered garments should be worn, with light-weight, non-slip footwear, reasonably 'grippy' gloves and a wind-proof outer layer (cagoule) being advised. You may also wish to consider some form of padding/protection for your knees, as you may well spend some time kneeling in the boats during the early stages of your development!

Wet loan items will be hung to dry within the clubhouse overnight - any items of your own may be similarly left, or taken home to dry.

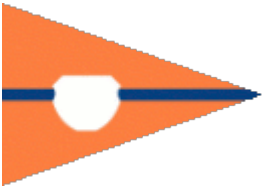
Facilities

Our facilities include

- A modern and spacious clubhouse, with comfortable changing rooms (hot showers!), a fully-equipped galley (kitchen), and appropriate facilities for less-abled members (including lifts for access to the clubhouse and boats)
- A training fleet of Optimists, Toppers, Teras, Picos and Xenons
- Four safety boats
- Challenger trimarans for less-abled members
- Extensive boat and car parks
- A large concrete 'beach' and slipway for launching / recovery
- Two pontoons
- Large outdoor seating area overlooking the water (great for lunch on good weather days)
- Free wifi / internet access

Food and beverages

The Courses do not include provision of food, although some light snacks will be available for purchase in the clubhouse, and more substantial sustenance is available at the Llyn Brenig Visitor Centre 400 metres away. Hot drinks will be provided free of charge. Most participants (and club members) just bring their own packed lunches / picnics. Microwave facilities are available in the galley.

Course Fees

The fees for the Course are set at £160 for adults and £110 for under 18s - however, thanks to the kind support of the Brenig Wind Community Benefit Fund, there is a 50% discount available to all participants who live within 15km of the Brenig windfarm. Please contact us for further details.

Club Membership

It is Club policy that you must be a member to attend a Course (for reasons of governance, insurance, etc), but Temporary (Day) Membership is included in the above fees. In line with not expecting you to make too much of a commitment until you know you *want* to, we also include **free membership for the rest of 2026** following your Course, to encourage you to continue to develop your new-found skills.

Naturally, family groups of Course participants would qualify for a reduced Family Membership fee under the same residency rules.
